“As a child I went to Sunday school, and as a teenager I went to church on Sundays with two of my mates and helped to give out hymn books. We also helped to run the church youth club.

At that time I was not sure that I was a Christian and I was not that strong in my Faith. When I join the navy, for the first couple of years the Church and God was not part of my life. It was after I got married to Linda and we moved to Hayling Island that things began to change. Our three daughters started Brownies at the local church, and we started to go to Sunday services with the children. It was there that both Linda and our eldest daughter were confirmed.

Some years later we moved to Liskeard, and we came to St Martin's and we were made so welcome. Then I found that there was a Bible group on the ship that I had just joined.
